<b>English</b>	We are rhyming again today. Tell your grown up some words that rhyme.	Read and enjoy <i>Make a Face</i> by Tony Mitton	
	Look at the words below and think of more words that rhyme. Try changing the first letter to make a new rhyming word.	Look at the poem again and this time find the rhyming words (don't include face). If you can print it out you could highlight the words but if not why don't you write them in a list.	Thinking about the different faces in the poem, see if you can write two more lines in the same style. Use the sheet to help.
<b>Maths</b>	<b>Addition to 20</b> Can you add the numicon shapes and write the answer? If you cannot print, write the addition first e.g. $10 + 2 = \underline{\quad}$ You can count the circles in the shapes to help.	<b>Addition to 20</b> Choose a number between 11-20 and write as many addition facts as you can for that number. For example if you chose 12, you could write $6 + 6 = 12$ , $7 + 5 = 12$ , $10 + 2 = 12$ etc.	<b>Addition to 20</b> Fact families Choose a number between 11-20 and try to write as many calculations for that number as you can. For example you could choose 3 and write $7 + 6 = 13$ , $6 + 7 = 13$ $10 + 3 = 13$ $3 + 10 = 13$ . We are not including subtraction facts today, but you could do so if you want a challenge!
