


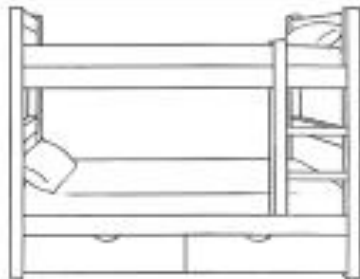


Measuring Lengths and Heights

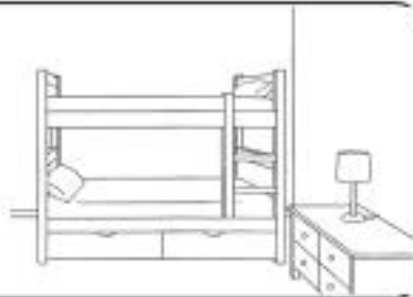
Measure your bed using your hands.

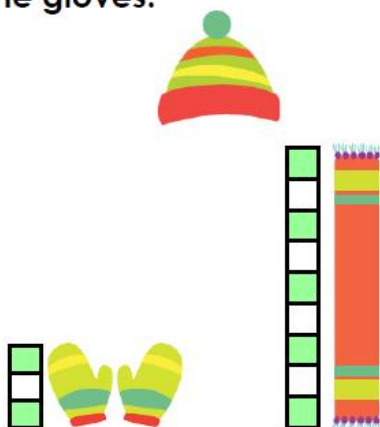

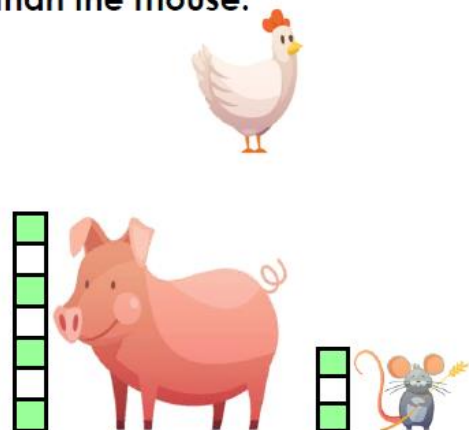

Draw and Measure Lines

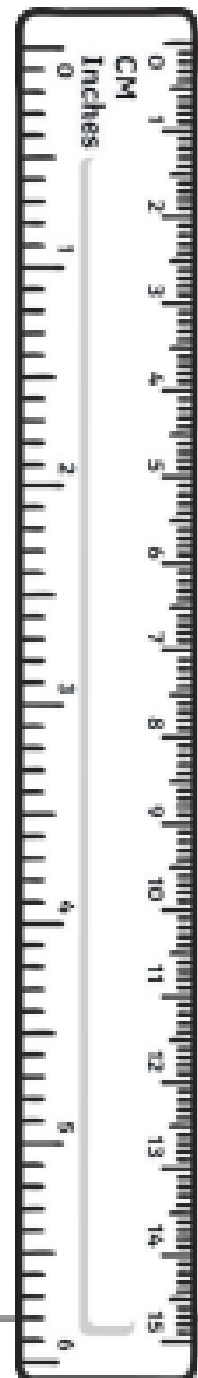
Amazing Fact
