
Reading in School




- Reading is a particular focus for the school this year.
- We aim to listen to the children read individually once every two weeks.
- They will also read as a whole class throughout the week during our ERICA sessions and they will have a smaller group guided read once every two weeks.
- We are implementing a new rewards system for reading.



Reading at Home



- Children need to have their reading books and Home School Links books in school every day so we can record all individual and guided reading sessions and also read your comments.
- We ask children to read their book (or a chapter of their book) more than once to ensure they have a good understanding. This is so they can:
 1. Decode
 2. Build fluency
 3. Comprehend what they have read

Maths

Times Tables



- Times Tables are an area of focus for Key Stage 2 pupils as there is a multiplication check in May for Year 4 children.
- It is essential for children to practise their times tables as often as possible in order to prepare for this as they will be expected to know all of their Times Tables up to 12×12 both quickly and fluently.
- TT Rockstars is a fun and engaging way for your child to practise. Your child should now have their log-in details in their Home Links Books.
- In Key Stage 2, we have a TT Rockstar of the Week certificate to celebrate Times Tables achievements.

Handwriting



Spelling

- Year 3 and 4 common exceptions words are in the Home School Links books (p. 25).
- We have introduced a separate 20-minute spelling lesson in addition to our English lesson every day. In these sessions, children will learn spelling rules and practise common exception words.
- Instead of a weekly spelling test, children will be practising 'Fast Five' words every day in school and at home. There will not be a weekly test, but these words will be tested in our half-termly assessments.



Homework

This is now a real focus on ‘The Basics’ - Reading (min 3 x per week), Spelling and Times Tables.

Alongside these further opportunities for topic - and subject based activities will be set these are encouraged, but optional.

Set Menu


- Daily Reading if possible.

Intervention

- You may hear your child mention they have had some intervention. This sounds very formal. Please do not be alarmed.
- Intervention may take place to extend children as well as support them. Or we may even just need to tackle an individual targeted area with your child- it does not mean there is a problem. Our curriculum is just very personalised.
