Our Curriculum

We plan our curriculum over 3 termly topics, where key skills are taught to enable children to achieve an end of subject composite task.

English

We usually plan English lessons around a story / text. This enables the children to develop narrative skills and explore, develop and then dazzle in their writing.

Non-Fiction Writing, Poetry and other elements are taught over the year.

Maths

We plan from the White Rose Maths scheme, where children work through the following...

C = Concrete (using apparatus)

P = Pictorial (drawing)

A = Abstract (written methods)

Then develop reasoning skills.

Reading (Little Wandle)



What will come home with your child and what will the communication about reading look like?

Children who need phonics will read 3 times a week in small groups of no more than 6. The book they read will be sent home as an e-Book to share and show off! This will be sent via Evidence -Me and will have a commentary of what they covered and learnt that week.

For children who still need phonics, 1-1 reading and teacher comments will not be as frequent for those that are at a phonic level. They will be every 6 weeks

Children will have a decodable book sent home and a library book to share. These 2 books will be changed as required . At the end of each half term, the class teachers will check in with the physical book band going home and change if necessary.

Teachers will also check the home reading that has taken place.

Once your child has become a fluent reader and no longer requires to receive

Little Wandle they will have the following reading provision:

Guided reading once every 2 weeks (recorded on Evidence Me)

1-1 reading once every 2 weeks (recorded in home school links book)

ERICA (Everybody Reading In Class Altogether)

Library book weekly



Spelling & Phonics



Children still needing Little Wandle, will complete daily sessions. Those children working above Little Wandle, will complete a 20 minute daily spelling and phonics session to further support and develop reading and spelling.
