Firstly, many thanks to the parents and carers who took the time to respond to the recent survey about PSHE. There were 42 responses from parents and carers across the school. We were delighted to see there is lots of interest in this very important aspect of the curriculum which underpins so much of school life. Questions raised by parents included 'What topics are taught in PSHE in school?' and 'How often do lessons happen?'. PSHE lessons are timetabled in every class alongside class assemblies and a whole school assembly dedicated to PSHE every fortnight led by Mrs Tomlinson, our PSHE lead. It can also be seen in Circle time sessions, debates and class discussions in all areas of the curriculum as the children learn and grow together.



Parents also asked about the content of lessons. PSHE is part of everyday life at school- in the way we care and show respect to each other, the way we help and support each other and the way we develop as a good citizen. PSHE provides children with both the knowledge and skills to manage their lives, stay safe, make the right decisions and thrive as individuals and members of society. It provides children with opportunities to develop skills and qualities such as resilience, leadership, communication, empathy and perseverance.



We are excited to say we have recently purchased the scheme 3D PSHE to support our curriculum and enhance lessons with a range of resources.
