P = Pictorial (drawing)

A = Abstract (written methods)

Then develop reasoning skills.

Reading



Once your child has become a fluent reader and no longer requires to receive Little Wandle they will have the following reading provision:

- School book band book (changed as required by children under the guidance of their teacher) We would appreciate it if you could complete regular reading with your child, aiming for 3 times per week and record this in the home –school links book.
- 1-1 reading once every 2 weeks (recorded in home school links book) this will be an opportunity to read aloud to an adult in school and enable staff to check home reading and encourage next steps.
- ERICA (Everybody Reading In Class Altogether) this will be completed 4-5 times per
 week in the classroom, this is a planned opportunity for children to be taught
 reading and we focus on reading fluency, prosody and verbal comprehension skills.
 The text read within the classroom will be from a range of texts by different authors
 and genres.
- Guided reading (once every 2 weeks) will be offered for children who we feel
 require an extra opportunity to further develop their reading skills. (recorded on
 Evidence Me)
- A weekly library book will be chosen by the child and can be read alongside their school book band to promote a love for reading.

Spelling



Children still needing Little Wandle, will complete daily sessions. Those children working above Little Wandle, will complete a 20 minute daily spelling session to further support and develop reading and spelling

Times Tables

Times Tables is a key maths skill and prepares children for the Year 4 Multiplication Check - please refer to your child's home school link book for further information.
