

Our Curriculum is driven by geography and history



- In geography we will learn about the geography of Biddulph, London and Kenya.
- In history we will learn skills and knowledge around the concepts of everyday life/ culture, legacy. We will focus on topics such as The Great Fire of London and significant people, such as The Wright Brothers.
- The other areas of the curriculum (art, design and technology etc) link to these curriculum drivers.



Phonics

Phonics is taught daily in school. We follow the Little Wandle scheme. Each week we will upload a learning sheet to the website that summarises our learning in school, so you can support your child at home.

We practise breaking words down into sounds (sound talking) and putting them back together (blending). We then encourage the children to read words fluently, by blending the sounds in their head.

Phonics Screening

- A national initiative to assess year 1 children. It is nothing to worry about!
- They will be completed by your child's phonics teacher in class time next June.
- It will check all of the letters and sounds your child has learnt during Reception and Year 1.
- It is to check their reading skills and ability to segment and blend sounds.
- There will be a meeting in the Spring term to share ways to support your child at home for Year 1 parents.



Little Wandle Reading

Children will take part in reading practise sessions three times a week to learn to decode books, read fluently with expression and to comprehend what they have read.

Their Little Wandle book, will then be allocated every Monday and collected every Thursday.

To promote the love of reading, we will visit our school library each week to select a book to share.


Please, please read as often as possible with your child at home. Remember to record this in your child's home/ school links books.


Post Little Wandle Reading

Children will have a book band book, this will listened to by an adult in school at least once a fortnight and we ask that the children read ideally each night, but at least 3x per week.

Book Band books are to be read 3x to develop fluency, prosody and comprehension.

Alongside this, they will complete ERICA (Everyone Reading In Class Altogether)
4/5 times per week and then we teach further reading skills in small group reads (guided reading).






Writing in KS1








In Year 1 the main focus of our English lessons will be to write sentences correctly.


We will enjoy lots of fabulous stories to inspire our writing.
















The Lighthouse Keeper's

Spellings

- Spellings will be linked to our phonics work/spelling rule and year group common exception words.
- Spelling of the common exception words is a big focus across the school. These words can be found in your child's Home School Links Book.





Maths

- The children are given lots of opportunities to explore new maths learning through discussions with partners and in groups; using equipment to support their understanding.
- We encourage the children to represent their working out in pictures and then demonstrate their depth of understanding when exploring reasoning and problem solving challenges.
- In Year 1 the children are encouraged to know their addition and subtraction number facts to 20 and will work with numbers up to 100.
- In Year 2 the children will be using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division knowledge to work with numbers up to 100.



<u>SENDCO</u>

- · Supports children with additional needs
- Helps teachers to plan appropriate provision and adapt any reasonable adjustments
 - Works with external agencies to provide quality, personalised interventions for children
- Works closely with the MHST to support children with anxiety or low mood.
- During the Autumn Term we have Mrs Holt as part of our team, she is at Kingsfield on a Monday.
- After Christmas Miss Mohring will be returning, her SEND drop in time is Thursday between 3:20 and 4pm where you can request a call or face to face meeting.


